



Roland Emergency Sirens



You might have seen them or heard them before, they sound like a loud train horn passing through town. The sirens are located behind the fire hall on the tall tower.

What to do when you hear the sirens...

The sirens sound when it is not safe to be outside. When you hear the sirens go off, go inside, take shelter, and if possible, turn on a radio or TV to a local station for more information.

Emergency sirens can be sounded for:

- Severe weather
- Hazardous materials spills

72 Hour Kit

It's a good idea to also have a 72 hour kit ready in your home in case of a continued power outage.

A 72 hour kit can consist of:

- Water, at least 2 litres per person per day
- Flashlight
- Food that won't spoil
- Crank or battery powered radio
- Manual can opener
- First aid kit
