

RURAL MUNICIPALITY OF ROLAND

BY-LAW NO. 16-76

Page 1

Being a by-law of the Rural Municipality of Roland providing for the removal and cleaning up of derelict vehicles from lands contained within the municipality.

WHEREAS Section 294 (3) of the Municipal Act being Chapter M225 of the Continuing Consolidation of the Statutes of Manitoba provides in part as follows:

Section 294 (3) The Council of any municipality, including The City of Winnipeg, may pass by-laws

(a) prohibiting a person from parking or leaving derelict vehicles on private property with or without the consent of the owner of the property; or

(c) providing for the removal from private property of any derelict vehicle parked or left thereon in contravention of a by-law passed under this section and for the impoundment, storage, destruction, or disposition thereof; or

(d) fixing the charges for the removal, impoundment, storage, destruction, or disposition of any derelict vehicle removed from private property under the authority of a by-law passed under this section; or

(e) imposing a fine of not more than twenty dollars on any person found guilty of violating the provisions of any such by-law, and providing that each day on which the violation of the provisions of the by-law continues is a separate offence;

or in respect of any two or more of the matters mentioned in this subsection.

AND WHEREAS the Council of the Rural Municipality of Roland considers it necessary, desirable and expedient to enact a by-law and to enforce the same, if compelled, to ensure no derelict vehicles remain on lands within the municipality.

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Rural Municipality of Roland in open Council duly assembled enacts as follows:

1. In this by-law 'derelict vehicle' shall be defined as in the 'Municipal Act' of Manitoba being Chapter M225 of the Continuing Consolidation of the Statutes of Manitoba. 294 (114)
2. No person shall park or leave a derelict vehicle on private property with or without the consent of the owner of the property.
3. The Rural Municipality of Roland shall remove or cause to be removed from private property any derelict vehicle parked or left thereon in contravention of this by-law for the impoundment, storage, destruction, or disposition thereof.
4. The Rural Municipality of Roland hereby fixes the charges for the removal, impoundment, storage, destruction or disposition of any derelict vehicle

removed from private property hereunder as those costs reasonably incurred therein.

5. That prior to any removal, impoundment, storage, destruction or disposition of derelict vehicles the owners thereof or the owners of the lands containing the vehicle or vehicles shall be jointly and severally given notice that:

(a) removal must be effected by a date set in the notice;

(b) upon failure to comply with the direction set out in the notice by the date given therein, the Rural Municipality of Roland will remove or cause to be removed the vehicle or vehicles in question;

(c) that costs of removal will be charged by the Rural Municipality of Roland, jointly and severally, to the owner of the derelict vehicle and the owner of the property from which it was removed.

6. The Rural Municipality of Roland shall impose a fine not exceeding Twenty (\$20.00) Dollars, or not exceeding an amount as set from time to time under the said Municipal Act with reference to derelict vehicles, whichever is the greater, on any person found guilty of violating any of the provisions of this by-law.

7. Each day that a violation of this by-law continues shall constitute a separate offence hereunder.

8. This By-Law shall take effect on the date of the final passing thereof.
